## **TRIP POLICY**

In an effort to create an atmosphere of consistency, responsibility and fairness to all overnight curricular and extra-curricular trips, the following guidelines apply (in addition to NAD policy where applicable):

Attendance Requirements	Touring is an expectation	Optional	
School Days Missed	All touring groups may have three (3) days of school off.		
Cost	<ul> <li>Student out-of-pocket expenses for a single trip should not exceed ½ of the monthly constituent tuition payment.</li> <li>The cost of any international trip should be approved by the March BOT of the preceding school year. This would allow each student summer employment advantage.</li> </ul>		
Eligibility	<ul> <li>A list of interested students shall be submitted to the business office for financial clearance as deemed appropriate by the Business Manager.</li> <li>All financial responsibilities must be current.</li> <li>Students having any F's and/or two (2) or more D's will not be allowed to participate in any school sponsored overnight trip(s).</li> </ul>		
Responsibility	<ul> <li>Students are to respect school regulations in effect during all trips.</li> <li>When a group is divided for an activity, students must be in sub-groups of three or more at all times and check-in with sponsors on a regular basis.</li> <li>Students that appeal not to go on class/extra-curricular trips will attend school as usual.</li> </ul>		
SPONSOR STIPULATIONS	<ul> <li>Ratio of adults to students will be one to ten or less.</li> <li>Sponsors must be approved by administration with an adequate male/female balance.</li> <li>An administrator (or designee) needs to accompany the group if fifteen or more students are attending.</li> <li>Sponsors will give warnings for misbehavior before sending someone home but some offenses, i.e., sexual activity, shoplifting, alcohol/drug use or blatant breaking of rules will result in an immediate trip home at the student/family's expense.</li> </ul>		

<sup>❖</sup> With the exception that yearly trips (i.e., music departments) could alternatively require two-thirds payment one year and one-third payment the next.
